The NOENMCC recently completed one of the largest energysaving initiatives ever undertaken in the region. The ambitious energy efficiency upgrades are expected to save hundreds of thousands of dollars and millions of kilowatt hours, making the facility significantly more sustainable.

Part of an extensive five-year capital improvement plan, the facility upgrades represent a major step forward in the Convention Center's plan to achieve LEED Certification – the most widely used green building rating system in the world, which provides a framework for healthy, highly efficient and cost-saving green buildings.

Enhancing the facility's aesthetic appeal is also an important part of the plan. Renovations to the Convention Center's 140 meeting rooms and public spaces are designed to reflect and celebrate elements of New Orleans' unique topography and iconic culture – while upgrading and modernizing the facility for a more energy-efficient and sustainable future.
